Diversity

Theology

At Sugar Grove Church of Christ, we recognize that diversity is God's intended design of creation and His kingdom.¹ This diversity is first revealed in the Triune nature of God, which also reflects the perfect unity desired amongst the community of God's people.² We believe that God has always called His people to be a blessing to all nations, without discrimination, and a visible expression of His kingdom.³ We believe that because of sin, exclusion and division can pollute a community.⁴ These effects of sin can only be reversed through the cross and the gifting of the Holy Spirit.⁵ Therefore, citizens of His Kingdom live without discrimination and seek a united diversity through the power and gifting of the Holy Spirit.⁶
