At Sugar Grove Church of Christ, we recognize that worship is a response to all that God is with all that we are.¹ As those who have been created in the image of God and designed to worship, sin shifts our worship from the Creator onto created things.² But through the cross we are adopted back into God's family and can once again cry out "Abba Father" as sons and daughters.³ This response is the result of the Holy Spirit as He engages our penitent hearts reacting to the truth of God.⁴ Worship is not limited to any moment in time or location, though it is certainly experienced in times of reflection both corporately and privately.⁵ For God's people, worship has always included a number of activities including living sacrificial lives, pursuing justice, and seeking righteousness for all people.⁶
